

Chambers was one of America's first aviation aces with the 94^{th} Aero Squadron and Beebe was presented with the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism in action while serving with the 50^{th} Aero Squadron. Our co-founders would be proud to know just how many USAIG employees followed in their footsteps by serving their country.

An original copy of David C. Beebe's book "*The First 25 Years*" which gives historical accounts of what transpired in launching USAIG – America's first aviation-only insurance company in 1928 - was given to the Beebe family as a keepsake from USAIG.
