PLAN FOR TURBULENCE, PREPARE FOR THE BUMP

Turbulence can happen on any flight. It's not always foreseeable, but predictive science and tools have improved. Crews should stay attentive to changing risk levels and keep themselves and passengers prepared for in-air bumps to the extent possible. Keep information flowing between cockpit and cabin. Put seatbelts and onboard stowage amenities to best use to keep people and items safe and secure.

- ▶ Confirm cargo and baggage are secured before flight and make seatbelt use a cultural practice on your aircraft whenever people are seated, including all-points for pilot harnesses.
- ▶ Communicate proactively; call for loose items in use such as phones, drinks, and computers to be stowed to lower injury risk when bumpy air is anticipated.
- ▶ Employ the best available predictive tools and weather products to identify turbulence risks for your route and strategies to mitigate them.
- ▶ Make timely reports of turbulence encountered to ATC to improve system-wide awareness.
